THE IMPACT OF THE CORONA CRISIS

When the Coronavirus severely dampened China's productivity at the beginning of 2020, it became clear that international logistics networks will face new challenges. Due to its global spread, the virus has long since become a global threat and hardly any logistics network is not feeling the effects, even if it has no connection to China. The question now arises as to whether logistics networks will have to reposition themselves in the future.

The Competence Center for International Logistics Networks at the Berlin University of Technology, funded by the Kuehne Foundation, seeks to facilitate the discussion on the impact of the Coronavirus on international logistics networks by synthesizing early lessons learned through a cross-industry online discussion.
